SERGEY SAPONENKO'S 50 YEARS ANNIVERSARY

On January 14th, Rocklin Church held an event dedicated to 50 years anniversary of a poet and publisher Sergey Saponenko who had a very uneasy life. Here is how he describes the beginning of his life:

"I was born in 1966, and from birth I was diagnosed with cerebral palsy. My arms and legs did not function, I had slowness of speech, writing was unheard of, I couldn't even eat by myself. I studied verbally. It was hard to accept that besides my relatives, nobody cared about me. I wanted to talk with my peers, but the sickness had created an impossible barrier for me. If only I could speak normally, and if I did not have any spasms! When I turned 20, I began to think about the meaning of life. I felt universal emptiness--the emptiness of life and its uselessness. This emptiness pressured me, and I understood that I had nothing to do with it. Both healthy and sickly, young and old experience vanity. But for what?"
