CONTINUED WORK ON THE BYLAWS OF THE ASSOCIATION

After being entrusted during the 81st convention to renew the Association's bylaws, there was progress updating it based on the current situation of the Association's churches. Over the course of these months, there was regular work done in all of the sections of the bylaws. The members of the Association's committee, and all of the head pastors of the churches, took part in this revision. In the upcoming meeting of the Association's pastors on August 24, which will take place at Russian Church of Bryte, a final version of the bylaws will be established. After that, the result will be presented for confirmation by the delegates during the 82nd Association's convention. NEWS FROM AROUND THE WORLD

THE LAWLESSNESS OF "JUSTICE"

In several cities of Russia, court hearings were held on employees of rehabilitation centers who were accused of allegedly kidnapping drag addicted people and holding them against their will in the centers, forcing them to go through rehab. Some people in the rehabs leadership were convicted to 6-8 years in high security prison. Thousands of people sign petitions about the re-evaluation of these cases, but as of now, no changes in these cases are foreseen.

A lot of believers are concerned about these results, especially because of mass media publications about the local authorities confiscating churches that lawfully belong to Evangelical Christian Baptists, Pentecostal and others. Pray that the time of freedom of religion and preaching of the Word of God would be extended in Russia. Pray for the spiritual and financial support of those who suffered in these persecutions.
