


NEWS FROM THE DEPARTMENTS AND CHURCHES OF THE ASSOCIATION

In this newsletter we will share about select ministries, but the full list of ministries could be found in the second section of the website – **Ministries.** For more comprehensive information, visit the Association's website.

- <u>Education Ministry</u>. The goal of this ministry is to equip the pastors of Slavic churches and increase the level of their education in spiritual matters, and to help in various areas of ministry. In partnership with Moscow's Theological Seminary, the ministry provides three levels of study: <u>A.A. Degree</u>, <u>B.A. in Church Ministry</u>, and <u>M.A. in Church Ministry</u>. The department is headed by Aleksandr Borisovich Pronin, who is a pastor at Bryte Church.
- <u>Missions Ministry</u>. In fulfilling the Great Commission, the churches of the Association have
 joined their efforts to reach out to those who are lost. On this page of the Association's website,
 you can find out how the department is planning to accomplish this goal. The department is
 headed by Vadim Yurchak, and its committee members are leaders of missions departments of
 the Association's churches.
- <u>Prison Ministry</u>. This ministry began in 2006 by a small group at one church, and now this ministry has representatives from many churches. They serve at tens of prisons and proclaim the news of forgiveness and being set free through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. The department is headed by Viktor Nikolayevich Butayev.
- Women's Ministry, Moms in Prayer Ministry, Ministry to Widows and Orphans. Although these ministries are grouped together in this newsletter, each one of them is an independent

- ministry, and is headed by different people. One thing that is common in them is that they are focused on serving among women. By clicking on the name of the particular ministry, you will be able to find out more details about each one of them, and get contact information of those who you should get in touch with in case you would like to join any of these ministries.
- Youth Ministry. The main goal of this ministry is to serve God, and to encourage the youth of the PCSBA churches to find their joy in Christ, to faithfully serve Him in sharing the Gospel in our circles, and do whatever we can in expanding God's Kingdom. The head of this ministry is Petr Makletsov.
- Information Ministry. . One of the goals of this ministry is to share information to churches and their members about the things that are happening in the Association and its churches, as well as about the Association's partners and other sister organizations and unions. This goal is accomplished through monthly newsletters and social media sites such as Facebook, Instagramand YouTube. Olga Avetisova is responsible for this ministry.

Moscow's Theological Seminary is now serving under a different status. While preserving its previous name, it is also now recognized as the Religious Theologically-Educational Organization of Higher Education: Moscow's Theological Seminary of the Evangelical Christian Baptists. The seminary gained a new license to provide education designed to train pastors.

HELP TO TAJIKS

Khujand, a small town in Tajikistan, was hit hardest by the landslide, which destroyed or severely damaged houses on July 13. Now the main road has been cleared, the electricity supply has been restored, and the mighty peaks of the Pamirs calmly rise above the village. But what remained of human dwellings was stuck in a dried mass of debris and mud.

When the team of brothers from the church in Dushanbe brought the first relief supplies to Khujand in July, the people were overwhelmed by the willingness of the Christians to help - and by your willingness to sacrifice, dear friends, which has made this first relief action possible. It is this testimony of loving care which causes so much gratitude in the hearts of the Pamir people. They feel that along with the relief goods, they receive the message that they are not forgotten, and that God cares for them through His children.

NEWS FROM AROUND THE WORLD

FOREIGN ORGANIZATIONS CAME UNDER RESTRICTIONS IN RUSSIA

The General Prosecutor's Office of the Russian Federation laveled the activities in Russia of two Ukrainian and two Latvian evangelical Christian organizations "New Generation" as unwanted, the press service of the department reports. Should these organizations continue their activities on the territory of the Russian Federation, they will be dealt with administrative and legal measures.

Although this does not affect the Baptist organizations yet, this decision by the government clearly shows the direction where things are headed.

In light of this, Pacific Justice Institute (PJI) developed documents to help Christians who would like to be exempted based on their religious convictions.
